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### EXECUTIVE SUMMARY: Military Families Revitalization Project (MFRP)

(Updated 09/23/2009)

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Currently, over 38,000 service-members have been diagnosed with Post Traumatic Stress Disorder (PTSD) and other serious service-connected injuries since the war on Iraq, with many of these cases leading toward suicide (over 144 since 2006) or severe depression. Depression, anxiety, insomnia, mood swings, and other signs and symptoms of this disease (PTSD) affect service-members daily. Many of our Service-members are returning home suicidal, depressed, injured, and are in need of family support. This epidemic not only has an impact on the Soldiers, but on their spouses and children as well. Injured service-members are in need of family support during their time of healing and recuperation which can range anywhere from 3 to 24 months, or until medically discharged. This shows the need for temporary housing units and financial support for family members to be in position to provide the necessary support required, especially for our Reservists and National Guard.

Many Service-members assigned to the Warrior Transition Unit at Fort Knox are positioned several miles from their families and home of record, in some cases several states away. Many injured service-members, in some cases, require family support during his/her tenure and treatment at Fort Knox. Due to the long travel distances and lack of family finances, injured service-members many times do not receive adequate family support. Some Warriors remain suicidal, depressed, and look for other alternatives to cope with the aftermath of war, while suffering from lack of support. Fort Knox services Service-members from **Ohio, Kentucky, Indiana, Illinois, Michigan, Wisconsin, and other states**. The facility is one of the best in the country, and offers excellent services for the families and the Soldier. However, if the family is not available, they can't partake of the services provided.

#### Faith and Hope Wellness Center (Phase 1-3)

**MISSION:** The mission of the Military Families Revitalization Project (MFRP) is to help make a change in a service-member's life today that will bring forth change for a promising future tomorrow. We will impact the lives of the Service-members and their families, the communities, military, and nation in a positive and effective way, bringing social and economical, mental, physical, and spiritual empowerment that will last from generation to generation.

**THE PURPOSE:** The purpose is to build an apartment complex for wounded warriors' families near the medical facility on Fort Knox (build in Radcliff, KY) that will allow for the family member to **1) Provide mental, emotional, and physical support to the wounded Service-member; 2) Be present at the time of surgery (if applicable); 3) Attend medical counseling and appointments with the service-member, allowing for the family member to be totally informed about the medical care and treatment the service-member is receiving while at the medical facility, as well as, play a vital role in the Service-member's healing process.**

**STRUCTURE:** EOM will have case managers that will coordinate with the Warrior Transition Unit case managers located at the hospital. As soldiers in-process, they will be assigned a WTU case manager. He or she (WTU Case Manager) will coordinate with EOM's case managers as to the soldier and his/her needs (to exclude medical care, i.e. spouse, children, apartment, financial counseling, etc.). EOM's case managers will coordinate with the office manager of the apartment complex and arrange travel and lodging. Included in each Residence Complex is the following:

The facility in itself will be a three-story building with 25 self-efficient apartments of 850sq ft. to include two bedrooms, full bath, kitchen, and living room with a basement for common area. Each complex will contain the following:

**Common Area to Include:**

**Physical Fitness Center:** For continuous physical training for both service member and family members.

**Counseling Office:** Used for family counseling (provided by Fort Knox staff or hired trained staff).

**Meditation:** A quiet room used for quiet time, prayer, or meditation.

**Computer Lab:** 15 Computer stations with internet for education and common use.

**Community Washer and Dryer Facility:**

**Morale:** Dayroom consisting of pool tables (2), home theatre system, and more for family use.

**Indoor Swimming Pool:**

**Individual Apartment to include:**

**1 Master Bedroom with Full Bath**

**1 Standard Bedroom**

**1 Full Bath**

**Standard Kitchen and Dining Area**

**Standard Living Room**
